*Karen has received this email from Jen-Rose sent on 24 March...*

Hello Karen and Martin, sorry you haven't heard from me sooner but have seemed to hit the ground running since I arrived...also took sometime for internet to be connected but now all good...well what an amazing experience this is from coping with very early starts on the 3 days I'm teaching as I travel to another campus from this Uni one and half hours away each way so wacked those nights when I get in...plus have to spend the good part of another day preparing my notes in very simple manner for translator to use in the classroom though power point slides have been useful...when I'm teaching I eat with 4000 students in campus canteen...the food is hot, good quality and nutritious...have also found a few favourite places to eat...the kitchen here is very basic so easier and probably healthier to eat out a bit as well I get out of apartment for a spell...the apartment is rather like the setting from a 1950's Russian spy novel, rather dreary and grey but at least have hot running water and heating in the bedroom....also have glassed in 'wee' verandah which I have now decorated with pot plants...they took a bit to find but worth the effort!...I met up with Chinese students wanting to practise their English at English corner last week and went to lunch with a couple of them...my translators are also majoring in linguistics this year so speak quite good English and have been very helpful in finding out things for me...as it is Easter next weekend and they don't observe it here, thought I would travel by train across to the coast to stay at the beach in Qingdao...a German heritage town so I'm hoping to find a Lutheran church for Easter Sunday which would be rather nice...don't have TV for BBC news but have found the websites and also a cafe which has the China Daily news in English so worth the 5kms hike to read...I was interested to read that the Chinese Govt was working on environmental issues such as water pollution and smoggy cities...it has been so bad here that it wasn't until last Wednesday when I was returning from the new campus that I realised the city was surrounded by hills and farm land as that afternoon a very brisk 'Siberian' wind had cleared the air for short time...this afternoon I went for a walk along a spring fed canal under the overhang of Spring blossoms so very pretty...I love watching the families out and about on Sundays...the people are friendly and seem happy souls...

Hope all is well back there.... How did the IWD breakfast go?...no doubt a good turn out and I'm sure Marceline gave a good address...

Best away and get some more work prepared for tomorrow...miss everyone but know this has been a wonderful opportunity
