

This stands for Zonta adopts an orphan, a project in which the Club funds 18 orphaned children whose families were affected by HIV/AIDS.

"As is found so often throughout the world, these children live with their grandparents, who themselves do not have an income to pay for shoes, uniforms, and the books which the young children require." The Zonta Club of Chiang Mai budgets \$3,500.00US annually to provide 18 scholarships for these children.

family (lovely people). After that, I started retail work again. First, was at Lowes (casual), then with My House (2IC and Manager) and, now, I manage the Rockman's Store at Cannonvale.

I have always had an interest in sport, encouraged to swim when I was a child because I had asthma. I started playing netball at an early age and continued to play, coach and umpire until I was approx 50. I remember my mother telling me once when I was in my forties "Kerrie don't you think you're a bit old for this now"? Maybe I should have listened to her.

I have always enjoyed craft work as well. Knitting, ceramics, doll and bear making and, at the moment, I am quilting. I have just finished a double bed quilt that's only taken me five years!

Ken and I had one grandchild when we moved to Mt Julian. We now have three and we hope there are still more to come. They are a great joy to us and we love being Grandma and Pop.

Through my work at Rockman's and membership of Zonta, I have met and spoken to lots of people with great stories to tell and people travelling from all over the world. I hope it continues this way (as long as my legs hold up). Cheers all, Kerrie
