Grant Application lodged: Last month we put an application to Council for an Equipment Grant for a Display Stand.

This is a flexible 8 panel stand which consists of an aluminium frame which has 360 degree hinging (meaning it can be moved into any configuration) to which carpeted panels are attached. Each panel is Velcro compatible so photos or posters or other displays can easily be attached to the panels.

District level.


