1. LOCAL SNIPPETS

Stanthorpe is a town in south-east Queensland, near the NSW border, about 220 kilometres south of Brisbane via Warwick. Its name is a derivation of "stannum", tin, and "thorpe" and tin-mining was an early activity. Nowadays, that has been superseded by the growing of vegetables, fruit, wine-grapes and the traditional sheep and cattle-farming. The growing and making of wine around Stanthorpe has become a major industry and is vital to the area's tourism, and this success is directly attributable to the climate we enjoy - four distinct seasons, including snow in winter in certain years, and an elevated altitude of above 800 metres. Because of the many granite outcrops that dot the area, we are known as the Granite Belt and this is a significant difference from other areas in the Southern Downs region. This unique physical landscape means there are some wonderful national parks like Girraween and Bald Rock where you can bushwalk and climb, and there are plenty of places where you can eat, drink and be merry.

2. ZONTA CLUB OF STANTHORPE

Coinciding with Zonta International's centenary next year is the Stanthorpe Club's 20-year celebration. Events including a Charter dinner in April are being planned.

We are a club of 25 members at present but will be inducting up to six new members in December. Our members are diverse, talented and all bound by a common belief in the Zonta ideals and the pleasures of friendship. This year we have warmly welcomed the District Governor, Sandy Venn-Brown, into our club as she and her husband, Steve, have moved up here to live

3. ACTIVITIES

Our goal at Stanthorpe is to promote Zonta and do essential fund-raising, with all that entails, but to have fun whilst doing it. To that end, we organise a series of activities usually every month, and these not only raise funds but provide enjoyment and camaraderie amongst our members and

supporters. Some recent events we've been involved in include a Wearable Art fashion show at our local Art Gallery in July, a Movie Night in August, a combined service clubs' Drought Relief function in September and, most recently, a very successful Pink Dinner in October.

The Wearable Art show saw Zonta members and friends modelling hand-made garments made by local knitters, spinners, embroiderers and so on. Set against the backdrop of the Stanthorpe major Art Prize and Exhibition, it was a quirky and delightful evening of art, food, wine and fashion and raised valuable funds.

In August, we saw The Greatest Showman in the Arcadia Theatre, an old and genuine picture theatre in the heart of Stanthorpe which has atmosphere aplenty! Again, it was a delightful evening where members and friends mingled, ate, drank and, of course, enjoyed watching Hugh Jackman in this most entertaining film. An entry fee and successful raffles saw the best part of \$2,000 raised.

The Drought Relief fund-raiser in September was a combined event hosted by Rotary, Lions and Zonta and which raised over \$16,000, the proceeds of which will be directed to the Drought Relief campaign. It was an evening of entertainment, food, drink, trivia, karaoke and more, and well supported by the community as well as the three organising clubs.

Our latest fund-raising event was our annual Pink Dinner, always held around this time and where we ask guests to wear something pink in honour of breast cancer awareness. All proceeds from this go to Breast Cancer support services, both local and national. This year we had the largest attendance ever and raised over \$5,000 which we are thrilled about. This year also saw a major raffle prize of a pink lawnmower, kindly donated by a local firm, Cattarins Mechanical Repairs, which saw over \$7,000 raised; these tickets had been sold, not just locally, but as far afield as Perth, so we were all delighted when the winner was discovered to be a local lady.

4. FUTURE EVENTS AND ZONTA SAYS NO.

To celebrate the Z1 birthday, the Zonta clubs of Stanthorpe and Warwick are having a combined lunchtime picnic at Girraween National Park on Sunday, November 4. This will be a relaxed and informal picnic with members and families from both clubs coming together in a lovely setting for fun and friendship.
