Leanne Olson shares with us her family's news: the exciting arrival of grandson Eli, and the sad passing of Alan's mum - both on the same day.

What a day Wednesday 16 July was. Luana was induced that day but by late afternoon the baby was quite stressed and quickly got worse. She had to have a caesarian but there wasn't time for the anaesthetic to kick in it was that much of an emergency in the end. We had been receiving texts all day and when things went quiet and we thought he must have been on the way. We received a message at about 5pm that said 'Lu needs her mum' followed by 'Emergency caesarian' followed by 'They are ok'. No details, no gender, no name. We had just left Akooramak from visiting Gran (Alan's mum) knowing that her time was near but hoping that she may hang on until the following day. We jumped in the car and arrived in Toowoomba to find Luana sitting there (totally numb and painless now) holding little Eli. After sending off our messages to family and friends, we received a phone call from Akooramak to let us know that Gran had passed away. Obviously she was just waiting for her little great grandson to enter the world safely before she departed. So we had to make some phone calls of a different nature. Poor Alan and Luana were just a mess but we have all now decided that 16 July is a day to celebrate two lives each year. Anyway, that's our story for one eventful day.

This is little Eli not long after he was born. He insists on having his right arm out all the time. Even in scans you can see it waving around. Funny little fella.




