United Nations

- **UN Human Rights Council in Geneva June 2007**
47 members held a session to agree on mechanisms that will enable the Human Rights Council to oversee human rights in the world in a more effective and impartial manner.
- **Trafficking in Persons Report June 2007**
The purpose of the report is to draw the world's attention on the existence of modern day slavery and the desperate need to eliminate it in the same way the world ended the African slave trade. Approximately 800,000 people, mostly female and minors are trafficked internationally and millions more within national borders per year. People are coerced into bonded labour, bought and sold into prostitution, exploited in domestic servitude, enslaved in farm and factory work and captured to serve as child soldiers. The report documents what countries are doing on prosecution, prevention and protection and what collaborative efforts can be done with the other countries and the US.

Tania Major was the youngest person ever elected to ATSIC. She has been featured on *Four Corners* and *60 Minutes* speaking about the appalling secrets of domestic violence in her community. Tania is the only person in her community in Cape York to complete Year 12 and a university degree.

In 2004, she represented the Australia Government as a delegate at the United Nations Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues. In 2006 Ms Major was named Queensland Young Australian of the Year in recognition of her leadership efforts and community work with young people in Cape York. A former board member of The Cape York Institute for Policy and Leadership, she is now working on youth development.

Ms Major accompanied Premier Beattie on a trade mission to South Africa to help build new bridges of cooperation and understanding between Queensland and South Africa. Ms Major says, "I see a lot of common concerns and want to see if there are opportunities for us to work together on a human rights agenda." On behalf of the Queensland government, she invited three young leaders from South Africa to participate in the Indigenous Leader's Forum and the Premier's Reconciliation Awards celebration in May 28-31 2007.
