These are the campaigns our district and club are currently involved with:

Young Woman's Bursary

Each year the club invites applications for the Young Woman's Bursary from girls making the transition from Year 10 into Year 11 at a Warwick District School. The aim of the bursary is to provide financial assistance to a girl who may be considering leaving school due to financial pressures.

Young Women in **Public Affairs**

The goal of Zonta International Young Women in Public Affairs is to encourage more young women to participate in public affairs by recognising a commitment to the volunteer sector. evidence of volunteer leadership achievements and a dedication to the advancement of the status of women. The program works at the club, district and international levels.

Zontian, Valerie Rose advised that the Chaplains Committee is organising an information session for parents and educators to address self-harm, in particular cutting. The Zonta Club of Warwick Inc supports this initiative, and will fund the cost of guest speaker Garry King. Though it is difficult to estimate the rate of self-harm as evidence suggests that only 10% of young people who self-harm will present for hospital treatment, Australian studies suggest that 6-7% of Australian youth aged 15-24 years engage in self-harm in any 12-month period. Self-harm is more common among young women, with 24% of females aged 20-24 years and 17% of females aged 15-19 years reporting self-harming at some point in their life. (Ref: Headspace) Garry King has extensive experience working with young people encountering the issues of self-harm and suicidal behaviour. He has worked as a teacher, youth worker and counsellor, and was appointed an adjunct lecturer, youth welfare at the Central Qld University and is the recipient of a Churchill Fellowship to the USA to further research youth suicide. He conducts Working with Young People who Self-Harm workshops, with one being held in Toowoomba on 10th November 2014 (Ref: ACWA)

Garry King will present a 1-hour session covering topics including:

- · Risk factors
- Those most at risk
- Protective factors
- A what-to-day and what-not-to-say for

September Dinner Meeting - Jan Byrnes

Jan Byrnes was the guest speaker at our September dinner meeting. Jan has taken up the challenge to coordinate the Relay for Life event at Warwick in 2013 and 2014. She described the strengths she drew on to fight cancer not once, but twice, and now is passionate about engaging the local community in events that raise awareness and funds for cancer services, and to actively support the Warwick branch of Cancer Council Qld. The Warwick community participated in Relay for Life on 13th – 14th September 2014, and Jan reported that approximately \$106,000 will be raised from 662 sponsors – well beyond the target of \$25,000. Jan is already planning the 2015 Relay for Life.

Relay For Life began in the USA in May 1985 when colorectal surgeon, Dr. Gordy Klatt, wanted to raise awareness of cancer and boost the income of his local cancer charity. He spent a gruelling twenty-four hours circulating a track in Tacoma, Washington, and raised over US\$27,000, and showed that one person really can make a difference.

Since then, Relay For Life has become the largest fundraising event for cancer in the world. Celebrated by more than 4 million people in over 20 countries, this inspirational overnight event empowers and unites local communities to fight cancer.

- Globally, more than one in three young women aged 20-24 years are married before the age of 18.

In most parts of the developing world they participate in crop production and livestock care, provide food, water and fuel for their families, and engage in off-farm activities to diversify their families' livelihoods. 
