The cushions are then provided to the Toowoomba Hospital for their breast care patients and they provide immense relief to patients who have lost a breast to cancer.

#### **Violence Against Women**

Zonta International President, Maria Jose Landeira Oestergaard, has written to Dame Quentin Bryce, congratulating her and wishing her success in her new position as head of the Qld Government taskforce to address Queensland's domestic and family violence.

Zonta International launched ZISVAW program (Zonta International Strategies to eradicate Violence Against Women) in 1996, and since then more than US\$3 million has been provided to support 40 projects in more than 23 countries. Focus this biennium is 'Prevention of the Root Causes of Violence through Education'.

Zontians believe that sustainable prevention requires an understanding of the root causes and the use of multiple complementary strategies operating on individual, relationship, and the community and society levels. Prevention should start early in life during childhood and early adolescence. In the schools, the strategy should be to teach children to recognize and avoid violence and abuse situations, and to build a climate of tolerance, promoting respectful relationships and mutual respect. As adults, we have the responsibility to actively defend and preserve the right to equality and to a life free of violence for all.

We look forward to opportunities to advocate for prevention of violence in our local community, and hearing how Zonta may support the work undertaken by Dame Quentin Bryce.






I am in Charlottesville, Virginia and just letting all my Zontian friends know of our new little addition. Sophie was born 29th July and is so far a good little baby.




