We learn about other clubs and shared what we do. Jill Lucht talked on finance. We can have members under 30 pay only \$52 a year. It's a trial and not in the bylaws. I raised the issue of people not able to afford it. I care very much that people like our young school teachers don't have the funds for a dinner every month and \$180 fees. Some club members give extra for the ones that need a hand and that is done anonymously. It's an open topic and they help ones in need of membership fees.

The hassles with dinner meetings can be helped: some clubs are doing is breakfasts or holding a meeting and then those that want to stay for a meal can. Members send a text "yes or No" for attendance, cutting out emails regarding attendance and/or for the meal.

Some club's projects are to pay for physiological visits, some are making sanitary pads that are washable and reusable. Breast cushions are made in aboriginal prints. Draw string bags with toiletries & snacks at police station for women, purchase (at \$34.00) personal alarms. There were science awards, a bush poet fund raiser, back packs with thongs, toiletries & sanitary items etc for the 10 young troubled girls. Police officer Kelly Chamberlains was keynote speaker (More on this next month!)

Z clubs have exploded: 7 in Mackay and they are doing so well. Takes 2 years to get going but they are going well. We think 9th November is 100 years for Zonta we need to celebrate; MAYBE a Melbourne Cup event?

Rosie didn't marry or live with Greg, the father of her son. She was the bread winner with an education and career. She says if "I was not white educated, middle class and privileged, no one would probably listen." Her book is incredible...she found it very hard to write and credits it to her co-author for the lay out and excellence. She did it for her son Luke. There may be another book later. It is a best seller and she gave the proceeds of sales to the woman's shelter.

She was very emotional when she spoke of being called a man hater... teary in fact. She has a brother and a father and a son. She does not hate men. It hurt her to be labelled that way. She is frantically busy. The talk at the Council Monday was followed by two visits to woman's shelters and a dinner with all the Zonta board. On Tuesday her lunch was followed by a school visit and I'm sure more.

The message was loud a clear: It's a huge horrible, problem. We need to get to the youth of today with this message: "Name and shame. Call it out." Call the police if you hear something. Get this issue in the front and centre. Access the Help Line 1800 respect or 000. Let's all become aware and care. It happens in all types of homes. Drugs and alcohol are no excuse. Many people drink and use drugs and don't kill....


